Position Summary

GLAHR is seeking a talented and mission-driven Graphic Designer to help us tell our story, mobilize our communities, and amplify the voices of those we serve. The ideal candidate is a passionate storyteller who will create visuals and content to help advance our mission.

The Graphic Designer will also be responsible for maintaining and enhancing GLAHR's branding and style throughout the content produced. As part of our Communications Team, the Graphic Designer will also work closely with organizers, storytellers, and campaign staff to create compelling, grassroots community-centered visuals for digital and print use.

Responsibilities

- Design bilingual (Spanish/English) graphics for social media, email campaigns, flyers, posters, toolkits, and educational materials
- Support grassroots campaigns with visuals for advocacy, events, storytelling, and direct action.
- Work with the communications team to get an understanding of the short-term and long-term organizational goals and then develop content strategies accordingly
- Creating and reviewing content for social media pages, websites, emails, field needs, and public communications

- Strong eye for design, color, layout, and storytelling—especially in community or activist contexts
- Strong commitment to racial and social justice, equity, immigrant rights, and GLAHR’s mission and values
- Effective time management, strong ability to prioritize, multitask, and meet deadlines under pressure
- Bilingual (Spanish English) preferred
- **Social Justice Values:** A commitment to supporting and working with community organizations, grassroots community. Alignments with the organization’s theory of social change and mission and promote that mission in correspondence with donors and founders.
